Volunteer Positions

Burnie Brae depends on the generous support of volunteers to assist with the running of activities and services. There are a diverse range of volunteer positions which may become vacant at the Centre periodically:

Homecare	Car driver to assist rural and remote clients visiting Brisbane with transport to/from airport, bus terminals, hospitals, medical appointments, and accommodation.
Transport	Car Driver, Bus Assistant, Administration.
Welfare	Project Pantry—packing food/hampers, maintaining/stocking/tidying pantry, foodbank driver and assistant, food distribution on market day. Positive Paces—assist with mental health recovery program activities. Community Visitor Scheme—visit isolated seniors in residential care or living at home in the community.
Maintenance	General tasks on site, grounds maintenance, assist Home Maintenance staff performing maintenance tasks for clients
Cafe Connect	Cafe assistant, food preparation, table waiting
Respite	Assist with program and outings for clients, bus assistant
Seniors Centre	General administration tasks, event assistants, fundraising support
